Mike Anderson webinars on OEM procedures



Trainer and consultant Mike Anderson of Collision Advice this month begins a new series of free monthly webinars, entitled "Learn to Research, Research to Learn," designed to help autobody shops more easily research and find OEM collision repair procedures.

"I'll be focusing on a different automaker each month, and I will walk shop owners, estimators and technicians through the process of using that OEM's specific website to locate the repair procedures, information and position statements they need," Anderson said.

Most of the webinars will include an automaker representative, and attendees will have an opportunity to text in questions during the live webinar to be answered by Anderson or the OEM representative.

Public input sought on proposed rebate program



The Oregon Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) is accepting public comment until March 14 on proposed rule amendments to establish a zero emission and electric vehicle rebate program in Oregon.

The program contains two elements one component provides rebates towards the purchase or lease of a new electric vehicle (referred to as standard rebates). The second element, called Charge Ahead rebate, would provide rebates towards the purchase or lease of a new or used electric vehicle if the purchaser meets three conditions: is from a low or moderate income household, resides in an area of the state with poor air quality due to transportation emissions, and scraps an internal combustion engine car that is at least 20 years old.

DEQ will hold two public hearings on the proposal; one will be February 26 in Portland, the other on February 28 in Medford. The public can participate in the hearings via webinar or audio teleconference as well.


