

Shop closes after 92 years in business

Third-generation shop owner Jim Bernard has closed the doors of Bernard's Garage, a fixture in the Milwaukie community for more than 90

Bernard said he'd been thinking about selling the property for some time, and his recent election as chairman of Clackamas County made the timing right. A developer acquired the property in downtown Milwaukie and likely will

begin redevelopment of it, possibly as a 5-story retail and residential complex, next year.

"This could be one of the biggest projects Milwaukie has had in many, many years, and now that Milwaukie has an urban-renewal district, it could provide some exciting opportunities for redevelopment, and I think that's great," Bernard said.

He said his family has a long record of service in the community. His grandfather who founded the business was a volunteer firefighter. Bernard, 63, followed in his father's footsteps by also serving as Milwaukie mayor while running the business.

The ins and outs of liens



NATA hosted a "Lunch & Learn" OREGON LIEN regarding what members can do Webb, Executive Director of NATA,

said, "After listening to all of the steps you need to take and the various ways you could do something wrong, I encourage NATA members to call Oregon Lien Services and let them handle this for you. You may be surprised how minimal their fees are."

Below is a summary of just some of the topics discussed at the April Lunch & Learn.

Did you know that there is a legal way to get paid for the money owed to you? If you are like most shops, customers come to you and ask you to repair their vehicle, you give them a price and then fix the vehicle. In a perfect world, the work is done and the customer comes in with a big smile and pays the bill.

In the real world, not all customers come back, even though they authorized the work. So what can you do? You have some choices...

Choice #1

Do nothing. You may assume the customer just forgot, or left the country to come back soon, or must be dealing with a tragedy. So you wait and wait and wait. Before you know it the vehicle has been there for a year.

Choice # 2

Send the customer to collections. This might work, but most collections companies will charge you 50% of what they collect.

Do a possessory lien. If you still have possession of the vehicle, you can place a lien on the vehicle. This is great, and anyone can do it, as long as you know all the steps.

Choice #4

Speak with the experts at Oregon Lien Service, and let them guide you through the process. We take care of the headache for you.
