Get involved with SkillsUSA





Another new high school diesel program planned




Last month we shared the news that Jefferson High School in Jefferson, Ore., is developing a diesel technology program. Now we've learned that McNary High School in the Salem Keizer School District is building new career and technical education (CTE) spaces, and one is a designated diesel shop.

"We will begin offering courses related to the diesel industry for the 2020-21 school year," Michael Melting, automotive instructor said.

The facility was designed during the planning stages for entire school improvement/construction. It includes a 5,000-square-foot shop with an attached classroom. The scope of the program will be what Melting refers to as foundational diesel. These classes can be taken such that students can jump off into any post-secondary diesel program, or even into the industry. The classes will include Diesel Engines, Fuel Systems and Performance, Hydraulics/Pneumatics, A/C and Welding, and an Advanced Electrical Starting and Charging course. More courses of higher level may be added at a later date. One year of basic automotive will be required to enter the diesel courses.

"I would also like to add that CTE is growing in the entire school district because of great CTE teachers and support from administration," Noel Thiel, automotive instructor at McKay High School (also in the Salem Keizer School District), said.
