New law reverses bond requirement

Gov. Kate Brown has signed <u>House Bill 2913</u> into law, reversing a law enacted in a prior legislative session that required some shops to obtain a bond.

The new law eliminates the need for mechanical and collision shops to have a \$20,000 bond if they use a mechanic's lien to protect their

business.
